

Meeting Minutes of Fire Chief's Association of Broward County –Ja, 2021

- I. Meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by Chief Downey
- II. Roll Call: Done
- III. Pledge of Allegiance, and prayer done by Chief Turpel

IV. <u>Presentations/Other Reports</u>

A. AMERICAN RED CROSS: Raymond Boyd, Disaster Program Manager

- 1. 25 cases and 85 people total cases in December
- 2. Working on the preparedness program for youth and adults
 - a. Raymond requested each Department's Safety Educator and Outreach POC
 - b. Chief Hastings from the Fire Prevention Subcommittee will follow up with Raymond on contacts for each Dept.

B. **BEMA**: - Lori Vun Kannon

- 1. Local and State have extended the status of state of emergency due to high numbers of positivity
- 2. County went back to mandating masks for the visitors
- 3. Working with DOH to provide community needs for more pop-up sites for vaccines and testing

C. Broward Health Care Coalition - Reshena C for Kelly Keys, Broward Health

- 1. All meetings will remain virtual due to positivity rate
- 2. Hospitals are meeting once a week for situational awareness
- 3. A situational awareness survey was sent out to all agencies this week on number of staff out of work due to covid-19
 - a. Only receive response from 9 agencies and it was due yesterday
 - b. Chief Shaw will resend the survey

D. **Department of Health / Broward County** – Terri Sudden

- 1. Positivity rate is 31.7 with 48,018 new cases up 19%
- 2. Weekly reports are available every Friday at the Florida Health Covid-19 site to check status of how counties are doing
- 3. Daily cases continue to trend upward; currently doing contact tracing
- 4. Rapid Q testing from K through 12 grade students are being done in schools
- 5. Expansion to 13 Covid-19 PCR testing sites in Broward County
- 6. Two sites through a contracted vendor in Tamarac Sports Complex and Margate Community Agency

- 7. Miramar Enrichment Center will open today
- 8. As of 12/31/21, 1.5 Million people have been vaccinated
- 9. CB Smith Park continues to provide monoclonal antibodies treatment
- 10. Two more additional sites at Tradewinds on 1/10 and Central Broward Regional Park on 1/10
- 11. Chief Shaw asked who operates on DOH testing and vaccination sites due to possibly drawing personnel from hospitals or private ambulance
 - a. Ms. Sudden said law enforcement and DOH parks personnel are assisting at the sites and no longer have EMS units on the sites. They call 911 if there is an emergency
- 12. Chief Moral asked the status of his resource request for N95 masks that was denied
 - Lori said the State has advised them to push out any resource requests and try to utilize private sector channels to get resources and are recognizing the need in the County
 - b. Ms. Sudden briefly discussed resources status and test kits expiration dates, extension, and supplies distribution
